Concerning our Scope 3 emissions on “waste generated in operations” we cooperate with AfB gGmbH. We donate IT hardware which we no longer require to them. If possible, the goods are marketed again. CO<sub>2</sub> emissions are saved by prolonging the device’s period of use. This is validated by a study of TU Berlin. AfB confirms the outcome of our partnership every year with the amount of saved CO<sub>2</sub> equivalents, saved energy in kWh and saved metals in iron equivalents.
